AgriInsurance Dollar Values Increasing for Most Crops



AgriInsurance dollar values are increasing in 2023 for most crops insured in Manitoba. Total AgriInsurance coverage for 2023 is expected to reach \$5.3 billion on 9.45 million acres, resulting in the average coverage estimated at \$560 per acre in 2023, compared to \$499 per acre in 2022.

Agrilnsurance Premium Rates

MASC has amended its premium rate calculations so that AgriInsurance premium rates will not exceed a 10 per cent increase year-over-year. This change will lessen the impact of disastrous growing seasons on premium rate increases.

With insured dollar values continuing to increase, dollar coverage for most crops is at an all-time high. Despite premium rates not increasing by more than 10 per cent, the combination of higher dollar values and minor premium rate increases may result in premiums per acre increasing by more than 10 per cent. The cost of premiums is shared by producers (40 per cent), Canada (36 per cent) and Manitoba (24 per cent).

Contract Price Option Program Expanded

The Contract Price Option (CPO) program is expanding for the 2023 growing season. CPO will be available for the majority of crops, including corresponding organic and pedigreed crops if applicable, excluding potatoes, vegetables, and forages. Producers who wish to take advantage of CPO must submit their contracted prices to MASC by **June 30**.

Established in 2020, CPO was previously only available for canola and field peas. This expansion of CPO will provide flexibility for producers in allowing them to blend the price from their contracted production with the base AgriInsurance dollar value (weighted by production) to better reflect expected market prices.

Excess Moisture Insurance

Previously announced in October 2022, dollar values for Excess Moisture Insurance (EMI) coverage have increased to \$75 per acre for basic coverage, with higher coverage options of \$100 per acre and \$125 per acre.

Changes to Wheat Classifications

Although there are no specific variety restrictions for wheat, the assignment of a wheat variety to a major class (or type) of wheat is based on the variety classification as shown in the Canadian Grain Commission Variety Designation List that is in effect as of April 1 of the year of insurance. Some wheat classes are insured by MASC under its *Other Spring Wheat* category as defined annually in the AgriInsurance contract. Starting in 2023, extra strong wheat and organic extra strong wheat are insurable as other spring wheat and organic other spring wheat, respectively.

Upcoming Deadlines

Final Date to Apply for, Change, or Cancel an Agrilnsurance Contract

The deadline to apply for an AgriInsurance contract and to make changes to or cancel an existing AgriInsurance contract is **March 31, 2023.** If we do not hear from you by this date, your existing selections (i.e. insured crops, coverage levels, and options) will remain in effect.

Adding Land for Excess Moisture Insurance (EMI) Coverage

Rented land must be added to your AgriInsurance contract by **March 31** to be eligible for EMI coverage this year. Rented land added after March 31 will be eligible for AgriInsurance coverage for seeded crops and for Hail Insurance, but not for EMI. Land that is purchased on or before **June 30** is eligible for EMI, based on proof of purchase provided to MASC. Contact MASC for more details.

Farmland School Tax Rebate Deadline

The final day to apply for FSTR for the 2022 tax year is March 31, 2023.

Probable Yield

As Probable Yields are based on a 10-year average with a two-year lag, data from 2012 to 2021 is used in this year's calculation.


